"Speak Up! is a 25-minute play that seeks to educate

schools, students, parents, and faculty about mental health awareness and suicide prevention education.

The play has been vetted by mental health professionals and comes with a digital tool kit that includes surveys and suggestions for the talkback after the play is shown. We are urging theatre educators to take this play back to their own schools, and pair with the counseling department to produce the play as an educational tool and to provide students with an outlet to speak up when they suffer. The play serves as a catalyst for a conversation. We had a booth at the Educational Theatre Association conference in NYC and got about 84 respondents who were interested in reading the play!"

"I work with an organization called The Illinois Caucus for Adolescent Health. Specifically, their theater company For Youth Inquiry (FYI). FYI writes and performs plays that speak to young people about issues like consent, sexual and gender identity, and how to end sexual violence and rape culture. My main role has been performing plays and teaching workshops in character about these issues. Recently, I have been working on a play with other trans and gender non-conforming artists about young TGNC folk better navigate school and healthcare systems. I feel that it is my duty as an artist to dream of a world that is safe and affirming for marginalized communities, and to shift culture in that direction.
